## **OBSERVATIONS FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR & ORGANIST, SCOTT BREINER**



During my most recent Covid diagnosis, I had the opportunity to zoom in on our worship service. I have been director of music/organist for over 15 years. When I first arrived, I insisted that choir would not wear robes. Some of my reasoning for this decision was as follows:

- They would need to be washed and ironed.
- They would be misplaced.
- They would not be properly maintained.
- Wearing robes would make the choir more “exclusive” instead of being a part of the Grace congregation (inclusive).

Some choir members wanted to process every Sunday and I knew that this would also be problematic.

Our congregation has lost many members over my time here and a lot of those good ole souls used to fill in the front pews. Interesting observation! Why is it that people who attend sporting events and concerts usually want to sit as close to the “action” as possible, but when attending church, tend to sit far from the action? Our sanctuary is fairly long and not very large and when watching the service online, it looks very empty to those watching!

I would like to invite you all to move closer to the cross (where the action takes place) and also get a bit closer to me and the choir, who are all members of the family at Grace. Let the online viewers see for themselves that Grace is a “close-knit” family who enjoys worshipping “together” as close to the “action” as they can get.

## **REPORT FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT, JOE MARTIN**

Council met on 3/22/2024. Council agreed to use a new, incoming memorial gift for the upcoming Capital Improvement Project. The project will include new storm windows on the sanctuary, painting the outside trim of the church, beginning the process of replacing fire doors as required by the state, and finishing the work begun on the upstairs kitchen.

It was then agreed and made church policy to follow the recommendation to Financial Support Team to change the distribution formula of any other new undedicated gift monies to: 70% to the General Fund, 20% to the Endowment Fund and 10% to the Capital Improvement Fund. (The previous formula was 80% Endowment, 10% General and 10% Capital Improvement.)

Council has started the process of creating a committee to oversee the Endowment Fund. As the financial health of the church will become more and more dependent on income produced by this fund, it was felt that a team of 4 or 5 members with financial and investment background or abilities would be invaluable to our continued well-being. Any members interested on helping with this, please contact the office. This is a work in progress and the congregation will be kept informed as it proceeds.

On Sunday, March 24, Pastor Althea announced that she would sadly be leaving Grace to move closer to her family and take a position in Lebanon, PA. Church Council wants to assure the congregation that it has been in contact with the NJ Synod and all are working on making sure that pastoral care will continue as much as possible. The Synod's procedure to search for a new pastor does not formally begin until after the last day of Pastor Althea's official duties here at Grace. Council will then formally elect a Call Committee of six voting members of the congregation. The term of that committee will terminate upon the installation of the newly called pastor.
